EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

As part of the Malaysia Education Blueprint 2013 – 2025 to attract international students to Malaysia, INTI International University (INTI-IU) has taken the initiative by introducing the Study Tour Programme. The programme objective is in twofold; first, as an introduction to the higher education of Malaysia via classes and lab sessions, and second, to offer a learning experience to the multicultural and multiheritage Malaysia through visits to various cultural and historical sites around the Klang Valley and Melaka. INTI-IU has been offering the programme since 2016 and has successfully atracted over 2000 students from China, Japan, India, Indonesia, Morocco, Maldives, Brunei, Sri Lanka, United Kingdom, France and the Philippines.

INTRODUCTION

INTI International University Study Tour's ASEAN DISCOVERY EXPEDITION is to nurture global champions, broaden one's international perspectives, and heighten experiential learning within a multi-racial, multi-religious, and ethnically diverse population. Participating in the study tour is a way to build students' personal development, while offering them the opportunity to explore, and broaden their knowledge and gain a deeper understanding of Malaysia, ASEAN countries, and the ASEAN+3 (Australia, Japan, New Zealand) cooperation.

International Exchange Learning and Cultural Tourism are the essential elements of this study tour. A semester-long Study Abroad Program provides a life-changing experience for students, opening their eyes to different ways of life and promoting understanding and tolerance.

Other than choosing from a wide variety of existing courses offered by INTI, based on the interests of individual students, a tailor-made program for a group of 20 students may include academic courses such as ASEAN Community and Cultural Pluralism, China in World Politics and Economy, Malaysian Studies and Cultures and/or Ecosystems of Malaysia and Borneo.

INTI-IU 's Study Tour does not only expose students to different study environments, but it also serves as a platform to engage with peers of different diversity and provide them with cultural experiences, including a Day trip Visit to Melaka – UNESCO World Heritage City; a Day Trip to Kuala Lumpur – The Modern City of Malaysia; and a Day Trip to Putrajaya – The Administrative Capital of Malaysia.

As Malaysia is Australia's third-largest ASEAN trading partner, it provides a safe and friendly opportunity to experience learning within a multi-racial, multi-religious, and ethnically diverse population. 
