>> Outline

- This is a Korean language curriculum for foreigners who want to learn Korean.
- These courses are designed for foreigners who want to study Korean for more than 3 months and then later study at a university or graduate school in Korea, or to become fluent in Korean for business or employment.
- Courses are open for 4 sessions per year (spring / summer / fall / winter), 5 days a week, 4 hours a day. They are available from Level 1 to Level 6 depending on your Korean proficiency.

Course	Educational Goals	Detailed Information
L1	TOPIK Level 1~2	Basic to Beginner Korean Course - Learning basic language skills, understanding and expressing content related to familiar topics, and daily practical conversation.
L2	TOPIK Level 1~2	Beginner to Intermediate Korean Course - Using basic language skills for simple conversations, making phone calls, and other functional skills. - Distinguishing between formal and informal situations and using appropriate language.
L3	TOPIK Level 3~4	Intermediate Korean Course - Speaking Korean in a variety of public facilities such as the bank, immigration office, supermarket, etc. - Expressing your opinion and using Korean socially. - Understanding the basics of spoken and written Korean.
L4	TOPIK Level 4~5	Intermediate and Advanced Korean Course - Learning more advanced conversation skills and also speaking in formal and business situations. - Understanding and expressing opinions on familiar and abstract topics.
L5	TOPIK Level 5~6	Advanced Korean Course (I) - Obtaining the necessary skills for research or work in a specialized field to some extent, and using Korean in both formal and informal contexts including colloquial and written contexts.
L6	TOPIK Level 6	Advanced Korean Course (II) - Accurately performing language functions required for research or work in a specialized field. - Speaking fluently without experiencing difficulties in expression.

- ※ Applicants from the following countries must apply and register for one year (4 sessions) of Korean language courses before applying for a language training visa (D-4):
Philippines, Indonesia, Bangladesh, Vietnam, Mongolia, Thailand, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, India, Myanmar, Nepal, Iran, Uzbekistan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Ukraine, Nigeria, Ghana, Egypt, Peru, Guinea, Mali, Uganda, Ethiopia, Cameroon
- ※ In consideration of the visa issuance period, applicants are encouraged to register early.
- ※ Students who already hold a valid visa within the session time period can apply for one or more sessions.

>> Eligibility for Application

- High school graduates or those with an equivalent educational background (not available for **expected** high school graduates)

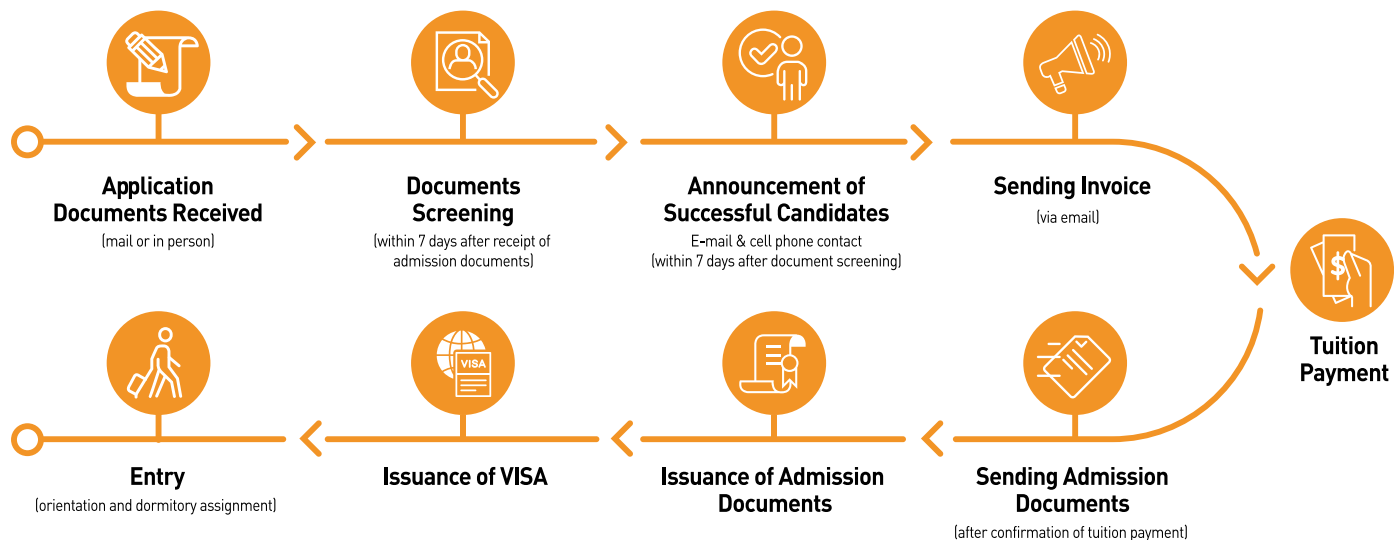

- The original documents must be submitted.
- In addition to the documents to be required in the application guidelines, you may be requested additional documents necessary to confirm the facts related to your application qualifications.

>> Screening Procedure

>> Education Expenses

- Application Fee: Free
- Tuition Fee: 1,000,000 won (for 2021-2022 sessions)
- Textbook fee: 100,000 won / semester (paid after admission, not included in tuition fee)

>> Attendance

- Students enrolled in the Korean language course must attend at least 80% of the total class hours (160 hours or more). If your attendance rate is less than 80%, you cannot complete the course. (Total class hours: 200 hours, 80% attendance time: 160 hours)

>> Visa

◎ Short-Term Comprehensive Visa (C-3) : not possible to issue a C-3 visa currently due to COVID 19

- It is generally called a tourist visa and can be applied for at Korean consulates abroad. Students who only want to study for one semester (or do not have time to obtain a D-4 visa) can obtain a C-3 visa to study in Korea and stay for 90 days. Please check these details in advance.



- Visa change and extension of the period of stay at the immigration office in Korea are required for students on a C-3 visa wishing to study for more than one semester. The short-term comprehensive visa is different from the general visa-free entry, and is issued only through the Korean consulate. Currently, only Japanese and German passport holders can convert to a language study abroad visa (D-4) even if they enter Korea without a visa. Please do not be confused with visa-free entry.

◎ **Language Study Visa (D-4) :**

possible to issue a D-4 visa currently

- This is a student visa for students who plan to study for a period of 6 months or longer. When applying for the visa at Korean consulate, students will need to submit admission documents and a certificate of bank balance for the Korean language program. Generally, it takes about 2 to 4 weeks to be issued, and the period of stay is 6 months. The length of stay for the language training visa (D-4) can be extended for the duration of the session in which the student is enrolled. Students who hold C-3 visa and enter Korea have to change their visa to D-4 to extend their course period.
- The standard admission permit required to apply for a language study visa (D-4) is issued only to students who have applied for and registered for more than 6 months. (Effective on July 2008)

» **Cancellation of Enrolment**

- ◎ If you apply for a tuition refund before the start date of the session, the full tuition will be refunded. However, after the session starts, tuition fee will be refunded as follows:
- From the start date to 1/6th of the session period: 80% of the tuition fee
 - From the start of classes to 2/6 of the session period: 75% of the tuition fee
 - From the start date to 3/6th of the session period: 50% of the tuition fee
 - From the start date to 4/6th of the session period: 30% of the tuition fee
 - From the start date to 5/6th of the session period: 25% of the tuition fee
 - More than 5/6 from the start date: no refund

» **Benefits of Korean Language Curriculum Completion**

- ◎ Students who have completed the Korean language course and enter the degree program at Yeungjin University will receive a 100% admission fee waiver and a 30% tuition fee waiver for the first semester of major programs.
